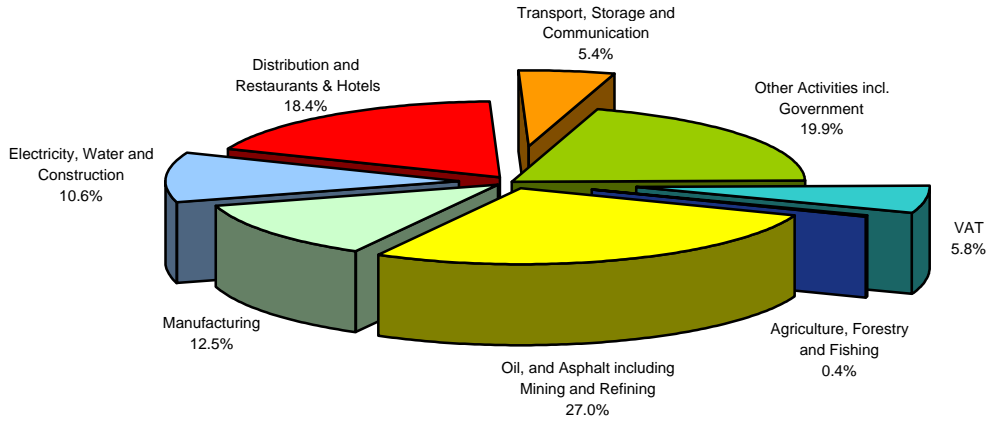

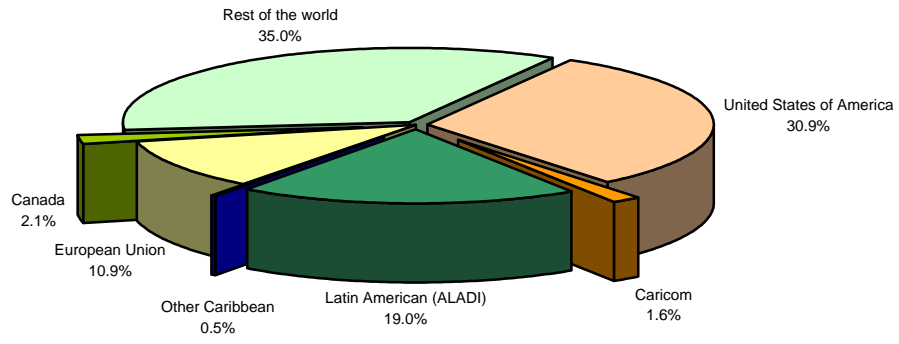

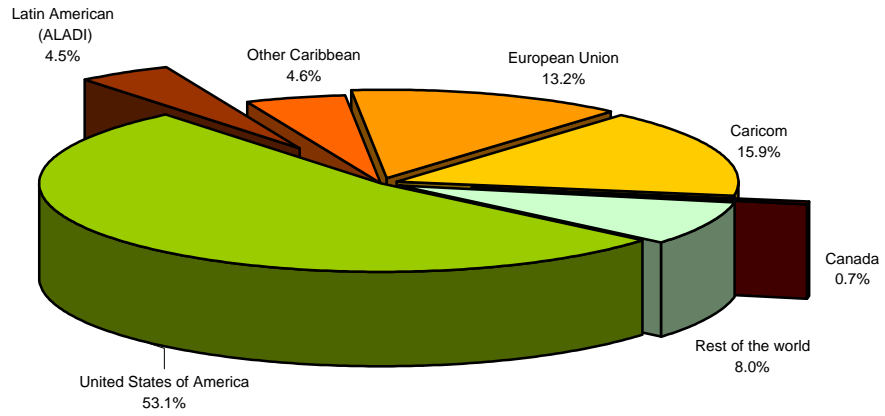
GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT (AT CURRENT PRICES) 2009
