- 1946 Full Adult Franchise granted

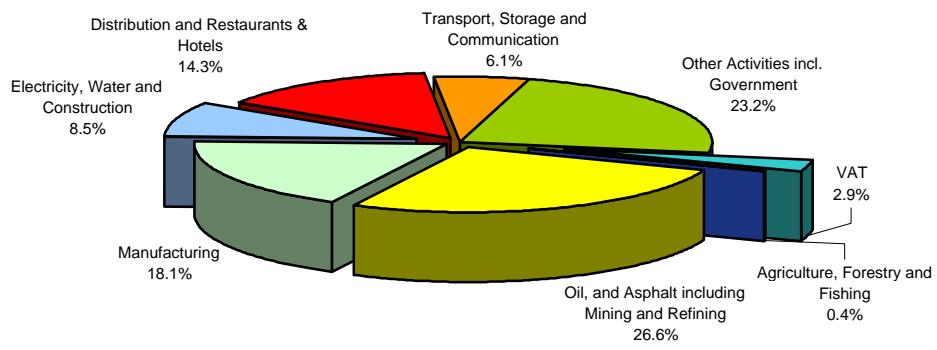

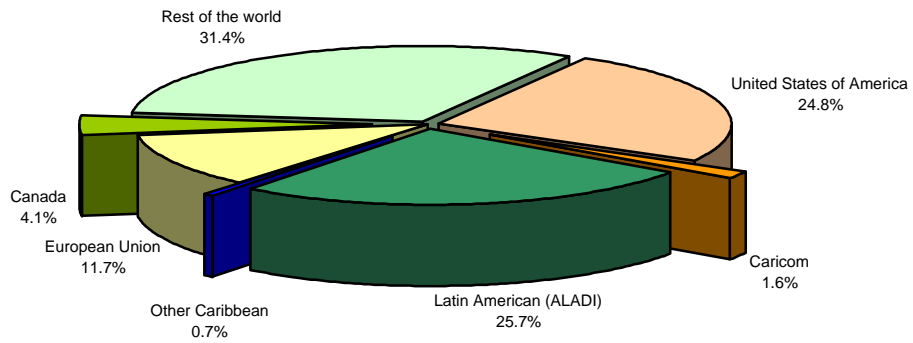

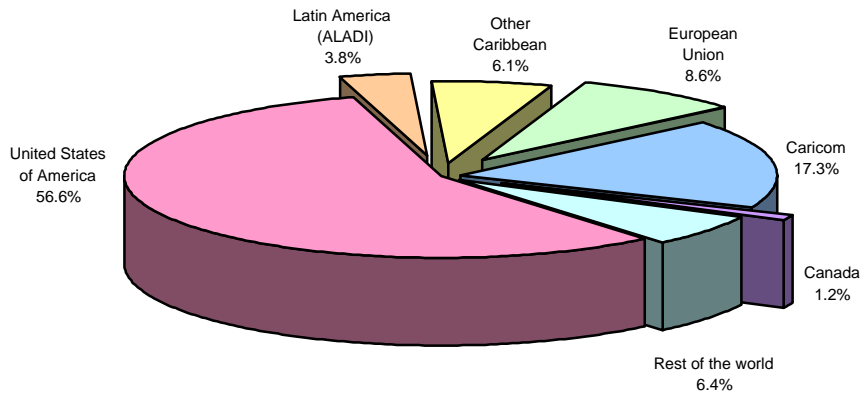
