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


SOURCE OF DATA / METHODOLOGY

The Central Statistical Office (CSO) receives ASYCUDA World data from the Customs and Excise Division (C&E) of the Ministry of Finance. This consists of all the information submitted to the C&E via the Single Electronic Window (SEW) platform.

The ASYCUDA World data is reviewed, edited and verified via a robust system by the Editors of the Trade Editing Unit of the CSO. Once all the records have been verified and meet the quality control targets, the data is loaded onto the Eurotrace platform which is used by the CSO to process the trade data.

Once the data is finalised, it is released to the public. Subsequent to finalising the trade data, CSO's Trade Section conducts a systematic audit of the data and if necessary, amendments to the final data are made. This is then released by the CSO as revised data.




REVIEW OF MERCHANDISE TRADE **Trade Bulletin - September 2015**

During the month of September 2015, the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago (ROTT) imported goods valued at \$4,974 TT Mn. Total exports (domestic and foreign) were valued at \$7,317 TT Mn, with foreign exports valued at \$607 TT Mn. A favourable balance of \$2,343 TT Mn in merchandise trade was recorded.

Imports of merchandise trade increased from the previous month by \$631 TT Mn (14.5%). Similarly, exports attained a 70.8% increase (\$3,033 TT Mn) over the previous month.


Chart 1 Value of Trade for the period Sept 2014, Aug 2015 and Sept 2015



Compared with the corresponding period, of the

previous year, imports of merchandised trade was \$5,827 TT Mn. This represents a decline of 14.66% for imported goods. However, when comparing exports for the periods September 2014 with September 2015, it was observed that there was an increase by \$343 TT Mn (4.9%).


Chart 2 Contribution of the Sections to Total Imports, Sept 2015



The three largest contributors to Total Imports for the period September 2015 were:

- i Machinery **Transport** and Equipment - 40.4%;
- ii. Mineral Fuel, Lubricants & Related Materials - 13.5%; and
- iii. Manufactured Goods Classified Chiefly by Materials - 12.7%.

In the case of Total Exports, the largest contributor was from the Mineral Fuels, Lubricants & Related Materials Sector (53.8%).




VALUE OF IMPORTS AND EXPORTS FOR THE FOOD AND BEVERAGE SUB-SECTOR

Food and Beverages imports increased by \$92 TT Mn (17.4%) from August 2015 to September 2015.

The three largest contributors to this increase were:

- i. Cereal and Cereal Preparation \$31 TT Mn;
- ii. Sugar, Sugar Prep and Honey \$29 TT Mn; and
- iii. Vegetables and Fruit \$28 TT Mn





The three largest Divisions that contributed heavily to Total Imports of the Food and Beverages Sub-Sector were:

- i. Vegetables and Fruit 17.4%
- ii. Cereal and Cereal Preparation 17.0%
- iii. Dairy Products and Birds' Eggs 12.4%

For the corresponding period, September 2014, when compared with September 2015, for the Food and Beverage Sub-Sector, \$19 TT Mn less was imported in Cereal and Cereal Preparation; a decline of 15.2%. However, \$14 TT Mn more was imported in Sugar, Sugar Prep and Honey (36.8%) sector and \$21 TT Mn more in the Vegetables and Fruit (24.1%) sector.



VALUE OF EXPORTS FOR OIL, GAS AND THE PETRO-CHEMICALS SUB-SECTOR

The ROTT key export of oil, gas and petro-chemicals increased by \$2,820 TT Mn (104.2%) from August 2015 to September 2015. The three major contributors to the increase were:


- i. Natural Gas and Manufactured \$2,122 TT Mn;
- ii. Petroleum and Products \$743 TT Mn; and
- iii. Anhydrous Ammonia \$269 TT Mn.

The largest contributor to this sub-sector was from the sales of Natural Gas and Manufactured (56.7%) while the smallest contributor was from the sale of Urea (1.1%).


When the periods September 2014 and September 2015 were compared, it was observed that:

- i. A total of \$977 TT Mn (21.5%) more was exported in oil, gas and petro-chemical;
- ii. \$2,013 TT Mn (179.4%) more was exported in Gas Natural and Manufactured; and
- iii. \$1,015 TT Mn (55.8%) less was exported in Petroleum and Products.



TRADE WITH CARICOM


The ROTT main CARICOM Trading partners for September 2015 were:

Imports

- i. Guyana \$19 TT Mn (27.5%)
- ii. Barbados \$16 TT Mn (23.2%)
- iii. Suriname \$9 TT Mn (13.0%)




- i. Barbados \$224 TT Mn (35.8%)
- ii. Jamaica \$119 TT Mn (19.0%)
- iii. Guyana \$105 TT Mn (16.8%)



For the period September 2015, 8.5% of this country's exports was with the CARICOM region. Exports to Barbados significantly increased from \$39 TT Mn in August 2015 to \$224 TT Mn in September 2015; an increase of 474.4%. Similarly, exports to Jamaica and Guyana recorded increased revenue to the ROTT of \$39 TT Mn and \$33 TT Mn respectively.

Exports to Barbados was \$132 TT Mn in September 2014 compared with the \$224 TT Mn in September 2015. This represents a 69.7% increase over the corresponding period. However, both Jamaica and Guyana reflected decreases in exports of 32.8% and 26.1% respectively.





TRADE WITH MAJOR TRADING PARTNERS AND PRODUCTS

The three main trading partners which the ROTT traded with for September 2015 were:

Imports

- i. U.S.A \$2,052 TT Mn (41.3% of total imports)
- ii. China \$435 TT Mn (8.7% of total imports)
- iii. Gabon \$407 TT Mn (8.2% of total imports

Exports

- i. U.S.A \$2,446 TT Mn (33.4% of total exports)
- ii. Puerto Rico \$857 TT Mn (11.7% of total exports)
- iii. Argentina \$837 TT Mn (11.4% of total exports)

The three major traded products for September 2015 were:

Imports

- i. Tugs, Pusher Craft \$724 TT Mn (14.6% of total imports)
- ii. Other Crude Petroleum \$629 TT Mn (12.6% of total imports)
- iii. Non-Agglomerated Iron Ores & Concentrated \$183 TT Mn (3.7% of total imports

Exports


- i. Natural Gas, Liquefied \$2,978 TT Mn (40.7% of total exports)
- ii. Ammonia, Anhydrous \$858 TT Mn (11.7% of total exports)
- iii. Methanol \$668 TT Mn (9.1% of total exports)


When comparing trade with the U.S.A. over the period

September 2015 with the corresponding period, September 2014, it was observed that the ROTT increased imports by 55.7% (\$734 TT Mn) while exports, fell by 5.4 % (\$140 TT Mn) to that country. The major ten product imported comprised 38.8% of total imports and the major ten items exported comprised 81.9% of total exports.

Foreign Exports - Merchandise re-exported in substantially the same form in which it was imported.
