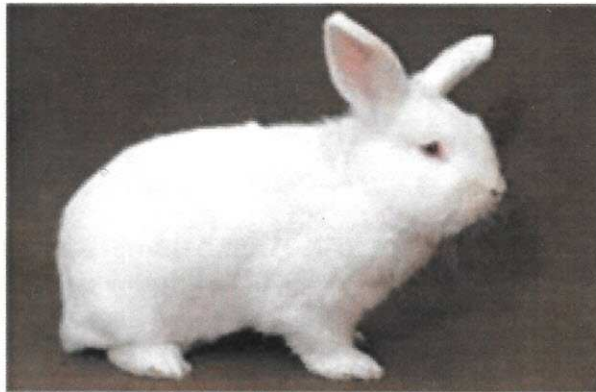

**SMALL RUMINANTS**



The Small Ruminants Bulletin was compiled from the information received through surveys carried out by the Agricultural Statistics Division of the Central Statistical Office.

The survey is based on a List Frame obtained from the 2004 Agricultural Census. The Frame is continuously updated by the field interviewers as farms go out of operation and new farms begin operation.

The design incorporates:

- (i) A census of all farms with a population of 50 and over for Trinidad and 20 and over for Tobago.
- (ii) A 10% sample of all other farms in Trinidad and Tobago.

The survey is administered on the field by interviewers on a quarterly basis and data are collected on the stock, type, acquisition and disposal of Goats, Sheep and Rabbits.

**Some concepts and definitions:**

Kids are young goats.

Lambs are young sheep.

Kits are young rabbits.

Meat sold –Trinidad, is estimated as 70% of the live weight sold (minus what sold to other farms) plus total carcass weight.

Meat sold – Tobago, is estimated as 70% of the live weight sold (minus what sold to Trinidad pick-up traders and other farms) plus total carcass weight.

This bulletin is based mainly on data obtained for the 1st Quarter 2018 (January - March). Annual and quarterly data for 2016 and 2017 are also provided in some tables.

The Central Statistical Office wishes to thank all Small Ruminant Farmers for their continued co-operation in supplying the required data.

Notification of errors, omissions and suggestions for improving the scope, form and content of this bulletin will be welcomed.

The number of goats found on farms in Trinidad as at April, 2018 was fifteen thousand eight hundred and seven (15 807) of which 57% were crossbred. Of the eight thousand nine hundred and fifty-eight (8 958) goats for breeding, 7 451 or 83.2% were female. Kids accounted for 19.4% of the total number of goats on farms.

Six thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight (6 878) or 63.5% of the sheep found on farms in Trinidad were crossbred. Female sheep were 80.9% of the breeding stock and lambs accounted for 13% of the total number of sheep.

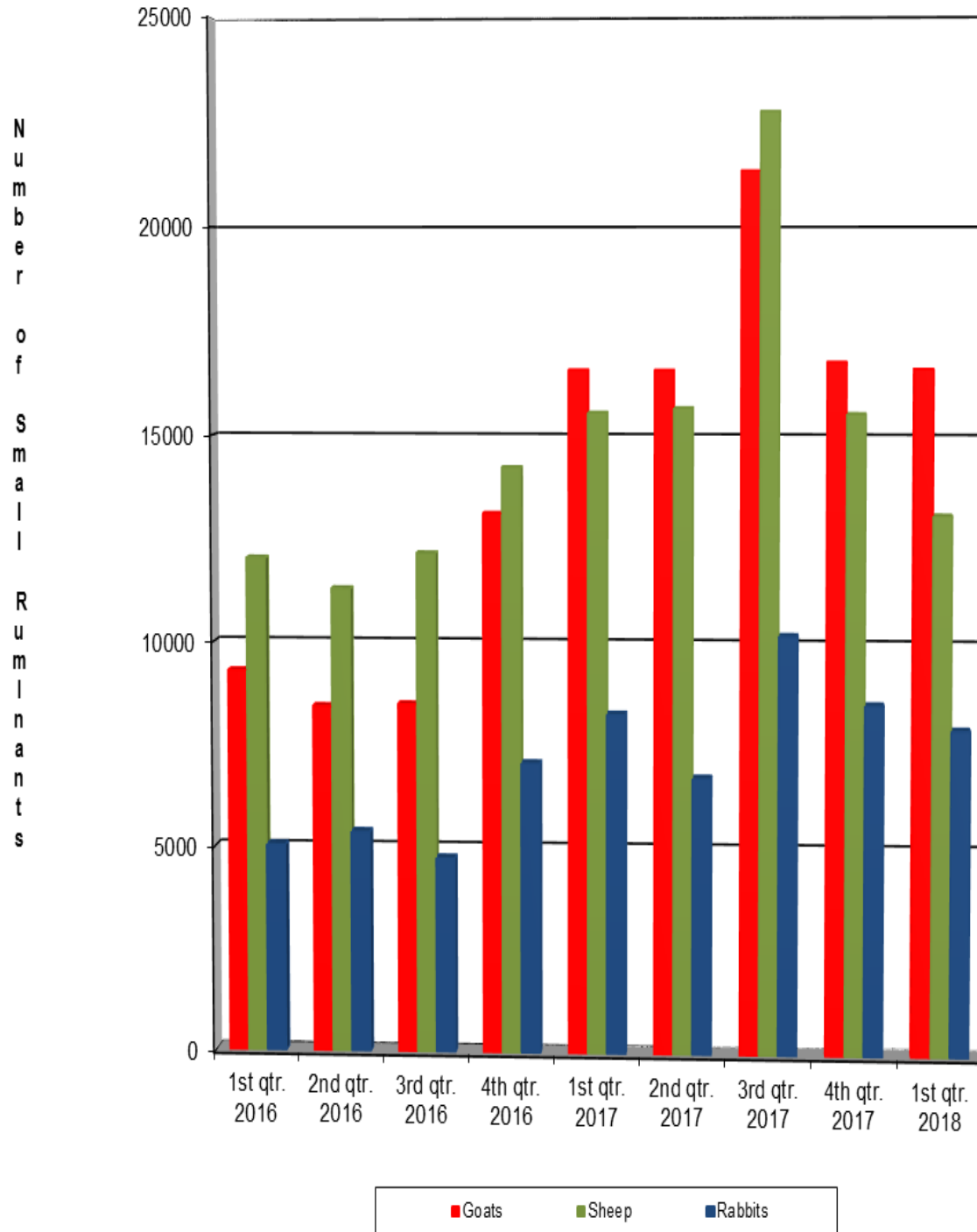
The Crossbred and New Zealander White types of rabbit, contributed 56.2% and 31.4% respectively of the total number of rabbits. Female rabbits were 70.5% of the breeding stock. There were 1 295 kits among the total number of rabbits (3 945).

Seven hundred and ninety-eight (798) goats, two thousand two hundred and seventy-five (2 275) sheep and 3 993 rabbits were found on farms in Tobago as at April 2018. The majority of these small ruminants were allocated for breeding, the total of which comprised of 468 goats, 1 522 sheep and 2 105 rabbits. Females continued being the dominant gender among the breeding stock comprising 78.8% of the goats, 88.1% of the sheep and 82.2% of the rabbits. Among the total number of small ruminants were 75 kids, 461 lambs and 1 812 kits.

In Trinidad, the Tunapuna/Piarco region accounted for 32.4%, Penal/Debe (28%), Couva/Tabaquite/Talparo (12.9%), Sangre Grande (6.8%), Siparia (5.1%) and the other regions 14.8% of the goat population. The largest number of Sheep were found in Penal/Debe (29.4%), Tunapuna/Piarco (24.2%), Siparia (8.5%) and San Juan/Laventille (7.4%). Rabbits were mainly found in Tunapuna/Piarco (56.9%), Sangre Grande (19.4%), San Juan/Laventille (15.8%) and Siparia (5.1%). (Table 3)

In Tobago, the parish of St. Paul had 45.9% of the goat population. St. George had a contribution of (41.7%), St. Andrew (8.5%) and St. Mary (3.9%). The parish of St. George continued having the largest number of Sheep (44.2%) followed by St. Paul (27.9%), St. Andrew (21.7%) and St. Patrick (2.7%). St. Paul's Parish reared 33.1% share of rabbits, St. George (32.3%), St. Andrew (19.9%) and St. David (8.2%). (Table 3A)

The majority of the acquisition of goats, sheep and rabbits in Trinidad during January - March 2018 was due to births, with goats being 95.7%, sheep were 94.5% and rabbits were 89.9%.

In Tobago for the same period, 73.2% of the acquisition of goats, 84% of the acquisition of sheep and 99.7% of the acquisition of rabbits were from births.

Excluding sales of Small Ruminants in Trinidad and Tobago, the main type of disposal was deaths. In Trinidad, deaths of goats, sheep and rabbits accounted for 91.5%, 73.8% and 73.5% of all disposals respectively. The disposal by deaths for goats, sheep and rabbits in Tobago were 31%, 78.4% and 88.5% respectively.

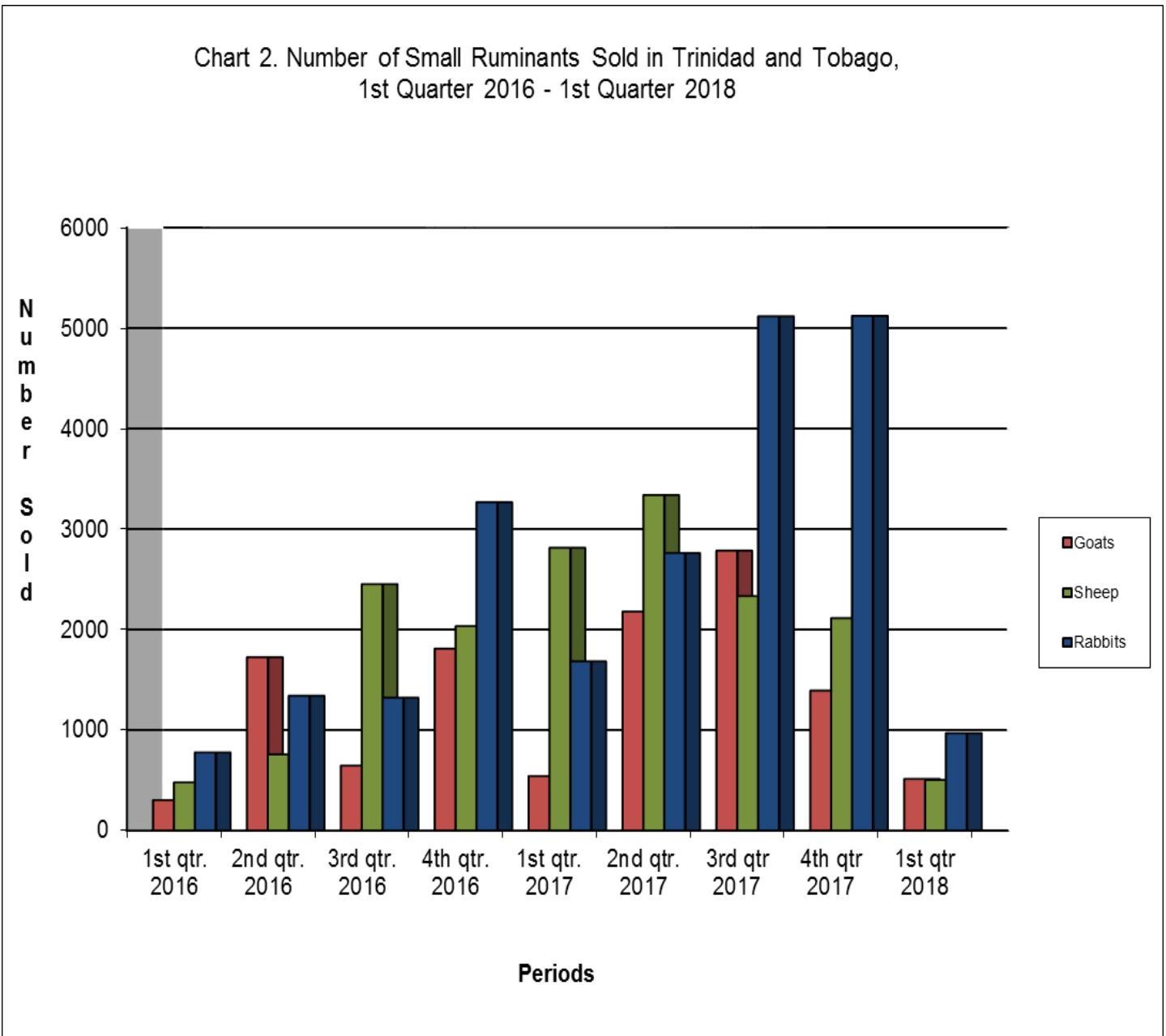


In Trinidad (Table 6), 251 goats were sold to other farms, with a value of \$747,965. The number of goats sold to households numbered 144 with a value of \$251,300 and 72 goats were sold to all other outlets with a value of \$129,240. In Tobago (Table 6A), the source of revenue from the sale of goats came from other farms and Trinidad Pick-Up Traders which totaled a value of \$18,776 and \$30,780 respectively.

Most of the sheep in Trinidad were sold to all other outlets (148), other farms (125), households (95) and Butchers (15). The total 383 sheep sold brought in revenues of \$500,627 of which the values for all other outlets, other farms, households and butchers were \$192,530, \$124,835, \$158,085 and \$25,177 respectively. Of the total number of sheep (121) sold in Tobago, 69 were sold to Trinidad Pick-Up Traders, 29 to households and 23 to other farms. The total value of sales for sheep in Tobago was \$152,248.

In Trinidad, 387 rabbits were sold to households and 87 were sold to all other outlets. The total value of sales for rabbits was \$67,665. However in Tobago 438 rabbits were sold to households and 51 to Marketing Department – THA. The total value of sales was \$65,041.

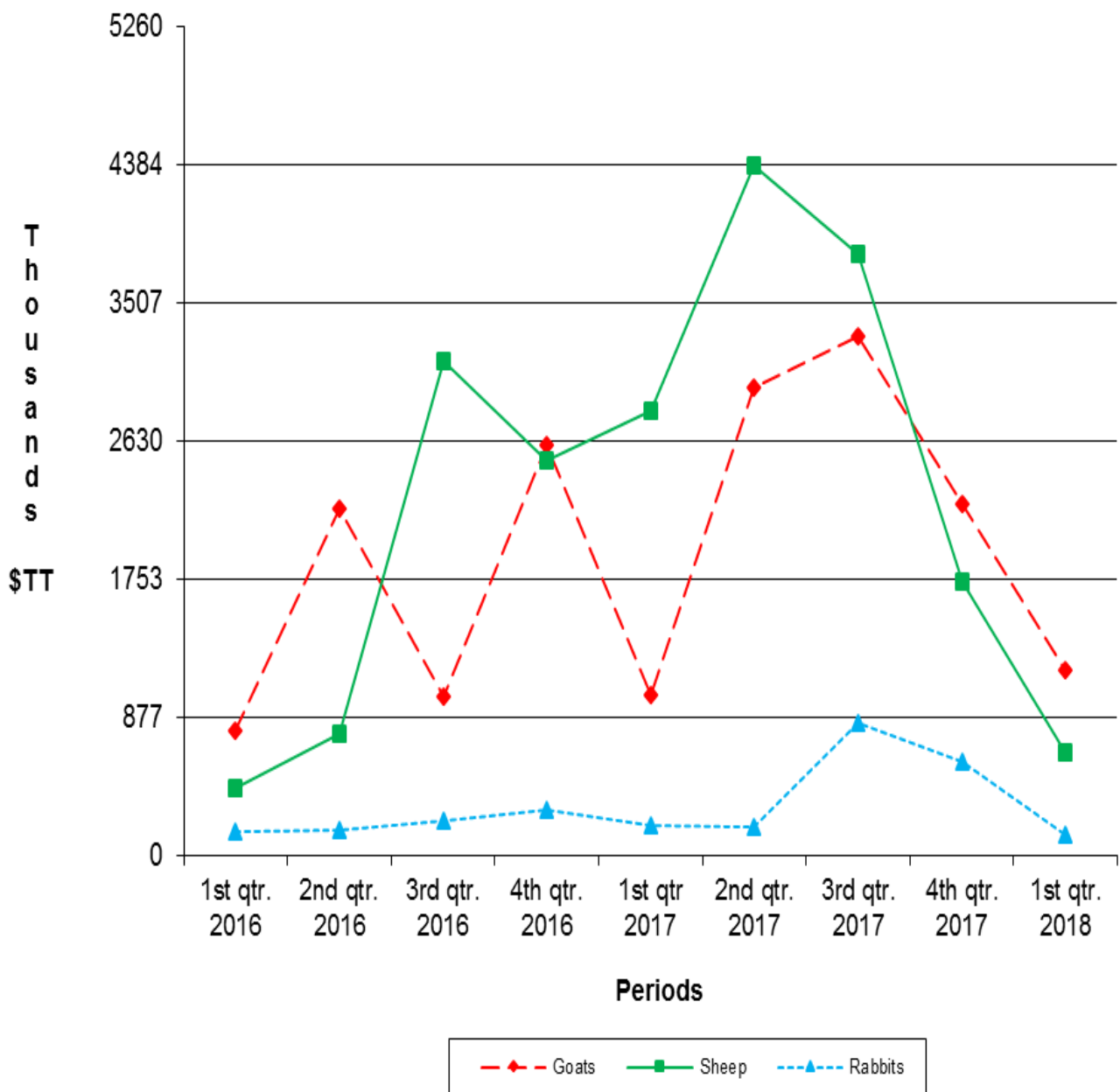

Table 7 (Trinidad data) shows a decrease of 11.4% in the number of goats sold between the 1st quarters of 2017 and 2018, also for the sale of sheep a decrease of 82.2% was shown. For the sale of rabbits a decrease of 59.9% was seen.

In Table 7A, Tobago data shows an increase in the number of goats sold from 14 in the 1st quarters of 2017 to 47 for the same period in 2018. However the sale of sheep showed a decrease of 665 to 121. The sales of rabbits shows an increase of 487 to 489 between the 1st quarter of 2017 and 2018.

Table 10 indicates that the majority of labour for small ruminant farming in Trinidad was permanent unpaid labour (233), of which 60.5% were male. Permanent hired labour was 13.7% of the total small ruminant farming labour force.

In Tobago, the total labour for the small ruminant farms was 26 all of which was permanent unpaid labour. The entire 100% was male.

Table 11 shows that High Feed Prices was 34.8% of the farming problems in Trinidad followed by Praedial Larceny (23.6%). Looking in further details High Feed Prices in Tunapuna/Piarco showed 31 complaints, the Borough of Chaguanas showed 30 and Couva/Tabaquite/Talparo showed 18. The region of Tunapuna/Piarco showed 44 complaints of Praedial Larceny.

In Tobago (Table 11A), only the parish of St Paul reported farming problems which was from Lack of Human Capital.
